



## FREE SPEECH PROTOCOLS

The First Amendment protects several basic freedoms in the United States including freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, the right to peacefully assemble, and the right to petition the government.

The Placer County Office of Education supports the rights of citizens to express themselves through organized non-disruptive demonstrations in public spaces.

Picket or protest in public spaces.



Distribute leaflets, flyers or other literature in public spaces.



Chant or sing protest songs in public spaces.



Block access to sidewalks or buildings or impede traffic.



March in the streets without a permit.



Disrupt operations or enter non-public/school spaces.



Engage in speech that is obscene, vulgar, or that is likely to incite an immediate disruptive or dangerous disturbance.

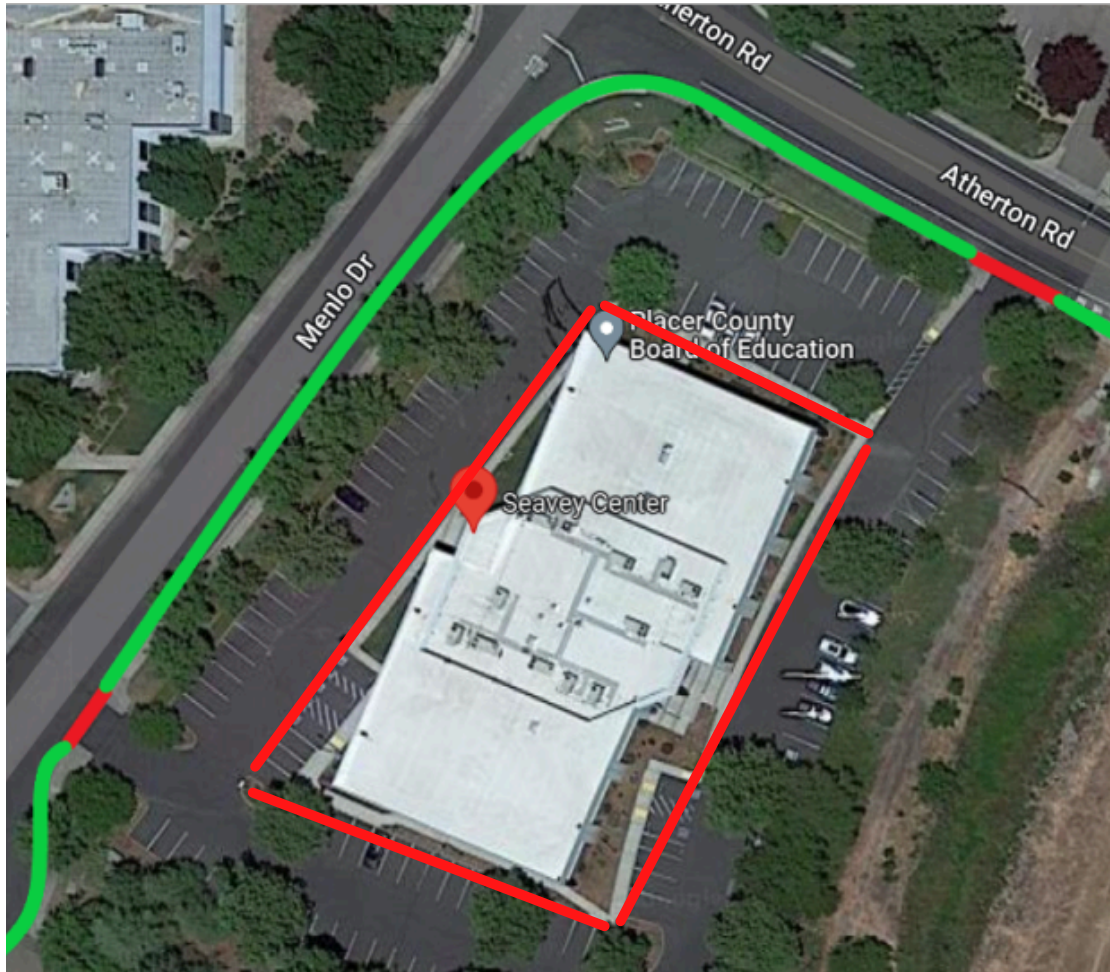
