All families in California, regardless of immigration & income status, are eligible to participate.

UPK is made up of a variety of preschool programs that may be familiar to you.

Your family can choose the best preschool option that meet your cultural, family, and life needs.

You know your child best.

Regardless of the UPK program your family chooses, your child should experience an environment where:

- Children of all abilities are supported and welcomed.
- Each child's culture, race, identity, and language is respected.
- Educators are ready to support dual language learners and encourage children to use their home language in the classroom.
- Children are provided joyful learning that sparks their curiosity and sense of belonging.
- Play-based learning activities are used to build the skills they need to succeed in TK-3rd Grade subjects.
